1. **Flock Name**—Typically this is the name of your farm or your last name.
2. **Flock number**—Your numbering system to identify your sheep. Example: A numerical number such as 99-1, 99-2, 99-3, etc.; or a combination of letters and numbers. This is your own identification system for your sheep and can be any of the above.
3. **Sire, Flock Name and Number**—This must be exactly as listed on the Certificate of Registry for this animal to allow traceability. You cannot rename the animal; for example, buy a new ram and rename him with your farm name. This destroys all traceability in the flock book.
4. **Dam, Flock Name and Number**—Same rules as sire.
5. **Breeder**—The owner of the dam at the time of breeding. If she is bred by a ram owned by someone else, the Certificate of Breeding must be filled out and signed by the ram owner.
6. **Owner**—Owner of dam at the time of lambing.
